Shorter travel time, more Park and Ride facilities and improved access to local shopping, neighbourhood schools and the South Fish Creek Recreation Complex, are some of the benefits transit customers can look forward to with the opening of the south CTrain extension. The Shawnessy Station and the Somerset-Bridlewood Station open June 28, becoming Calgary's 24th and 25th suburban CTrain stations.

The last CTrain extension was completed in December 2003 with the opening of the Dalhousie Station in the NW. This expansion is the third phase of a program to extend service on each CTrain line. An extension of the northeast CTrain to McKnight-Westwinds Station is scheduled for completion in 2010.



Purpose of the Rider's Guide

The Rider's Guide to the South CTrain Extension and Feeder Bus Network, will assist you in planning your transit trip when the new Shawnessy Station and Somerset-Bridlewood Station open June 28, 2004.

The feeder bus network for the Shawnessy and Somerset-Bridlewood Stations was developed through a collaborative joint planning process, which included stakeholders from community associations, transit customers, area businesses, Calgary Transit Staff and area Aldermen.

The process included stakeholder meetings, community meetings and several open houses.

This Rider's Guide will provide you with information about the two new stations and a preview to the new and revised bus routes and levels of service. Pocket Schedules (containing detailed schedule and stop information) will be available at the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre at 224 – 7 Avenue S.W. and at www.calgarytransit.com in June.








Southwest Loop




Millrise/Bridlewood



Introduction to the Shawnessy Station

The Shawnessy Station is located south of Shawnessy Boulevard and west of Shawville Boulevard. In conjunction with the station opening, new and revised bus routes affecting the communities of Bridlewood, Evergreen, Midnapore, Millrise, Shawnee Slopes, Shawnessy, Somerset and Sundance are being implemented.

The design of the station and Park and Ride was a collaborative effort involving community stakeholders and the Transportation Project Office, which undertakes projects on behalf of The City of Calgary. The features of Shawnessy Station include:

- Park and Ride for approximately 200 vehicles, located east of the platforms, short-term parking stalls (up to 4 hr. maximum), accessible parking and *Kiss and Ride* drop-off zones.
- Lockers and racks for bicycles.
- Staggered platforms with at-grade access.
- Security and safety features including surveillance cameras, suitable fencing and appropriate landscaping.



Introduction to the Somerset-Bridlewood Station

The Somerset-Bridlewood Station is located north of Shawville Gate and west of Shawville Link. In conjunction with the station opening, new and revised bus routes affecting the communities of Bridlewood, Chaparral, Evergreen, Midnapore, Millrise, Shawnee Slopes, Shawnessy, Somerset and Sundance are being implemented.

The design of the station and Park and Ride was a collaborative effort involving community stakeholders and the Transportation Project Office, which undertakes projects on behalf of The City of Calgary. The features of Somerset-Bridlewood Station include:

- Park and Ride for approximately 900 vehicles, located east and west of the station, short-term parking stalls (up to 4 hr. maximum), accessible parking and Kiss and Ride drop-off zones.
- Lockers and racks for bicycles.
- A central platform with at-grade access.
- Enhanced shelters and waiting areas.
- Security and safety features including surveillance cameras, suitable fencing and appropriate landscaping.












Copperfield





Transit Information Sources

A little advance planning can make your transit trip more comfortable and convenient. The following are some of our information sources:

Calgary Transit Website

www.calgarytransit.com can provide information about Customer Services, fares, individual route maps, schedules and accessible transportation.

Teleride

Teleride is an interactive telephone system that provides the most current schedule information for your bus stop. Call 974-4000 and enter your four-digit stop number, located at the bottom of the sign at your bus zone, to obtain current and future schedule times or general transit information.

Transit Maps and Schedules

The Transit map shows all of Calgary Transit's bus and CTrain routes. These maps are available at the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre (224–7th. Ave. S.W.), the plaza level of the downtown municipal building and some vendors.

The schedules for each individual route list the times when the bus leaves your starting point and when you will reach your destination. The shedules also list bus stop locations, a route map, the four digit Teleride numbers and other helpful information. Schedules are available from the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre, your bus operator or call 262-1000 or TTY 268-8087 (for hard of hearing).

Customer Service

The Customer Service Centre (224–7 Avenue S.W.) is open weekdays from 10:00 am to 5:30 pm. You can purchase passes or tickets, obtain printed transit maps, route schedules and other brochures, or receive help planning your transit trip. The Lost Property office is also located here (telephone 268-1600).

Customer Service Representatives can be reached at 262-1000 (6:00 am to 9:00 pm weekdays and 8:00 am to 6:00 pm on weekends and holidays). Customer Service Representatives can assist you in finding a bus or CTrain route you need, tell you where your bus zone or stop is located, and where to transfer for connecting transit services.

Access Calgary

Access Calgary is responsible for managing eligibility, booking, scheduling and dispatching shared-ride, door-to-door transportation services for Calgarians with disabilities. Access Calgary was formed in the spring of 2001 in order to integrate transportation services that had been provided separately through Calgary Handi-Bus and Special Needs Taxi. Safety & Security Measures

Uniformed and plain-clothed Protective Services Officers patrol Calgary Transit facilities around-the-clock. They protect transit customers, employees and property, promote public safety and awareness and enforce by-laws and provincial statutes 24hour/day, 7 days a week on all Calgary Transit property.

A network of over 330 closed circuit cameras exist throughout the CTrain line which monitor the stations, platforms, escalators, halls and stairs. These cameras are overseen around-the-clock by Calgary Transit personnel. All CTrain cars, platforms and stations are equipped with a red HELP button so in an emergency, customers can contact Calgary Transit Control Centre personnel who will provide instructions and send emergency help immediately. Calgary Transit bus operators also have radio-equipment they can use in an emergency to notify the appropriate personnel.
