# Introduction to McKnight-Westwinds Station

Opening Dec. 17, the design of the McKnight-Westwinds Station, feeder-bus network and Park and Ride are the collaborative result of the efforts of many stakeholders, including community associations, transit customers, Transportation Infrastructure, Calgary Transit staff and area Aldermen.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the planning process to bring enhanced transit service to the citizens of Calgary.

Shorter travel time, improved access to local businesses, shopping, neighbourhood schools, Prairie Winds Park and more Park and Ride facilities are just a few of the benefits transit customers can look forward to with the opening of the northeast CTrain extension.

The McKnight-Westwinds Station is located north of McKnight Boulevard. In conjunction with the station opening, there are new and revised bus routes serving the communities of Saddleridge, Martindale, Taradale, Castleridge, Falconridge and Coral Springs.

This Rider's Guide provides information about the new station and a preview to the new and revised bus routes and levels of service. Pocket schedules (containing detailed schedule and stop information) will be available at the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre at 224 Seventh Ave. S.W. and on the Web at www.calgarytransit.com in late November.



Features of McKnight-Westwinds Station include:

- Racks for bicycles.
- A central platform with at-grade access.
- Enhanced shelters and heated waiting areas.
- Security and safety features including surveillance cameras, suitable fencing and landscaping.
- Park and Ride for approximately 900 vehicles, accessible parking and passenger drop-off zones.
- Integration of Public Art.

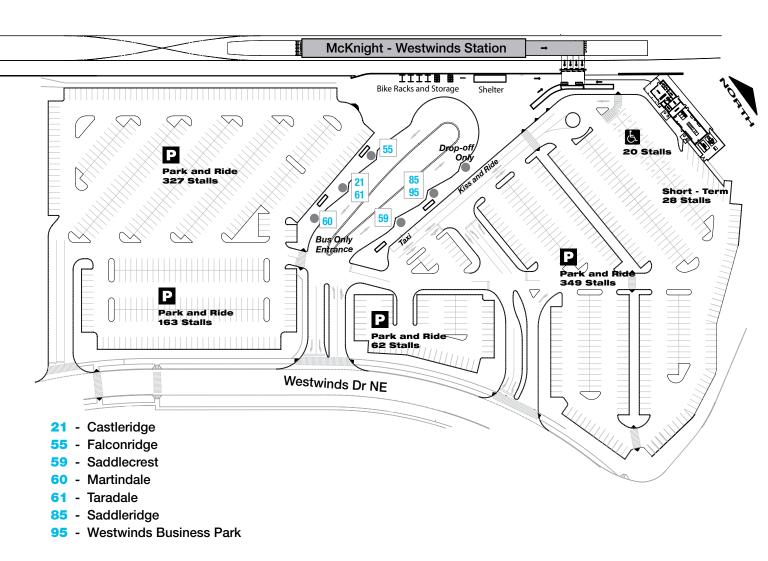

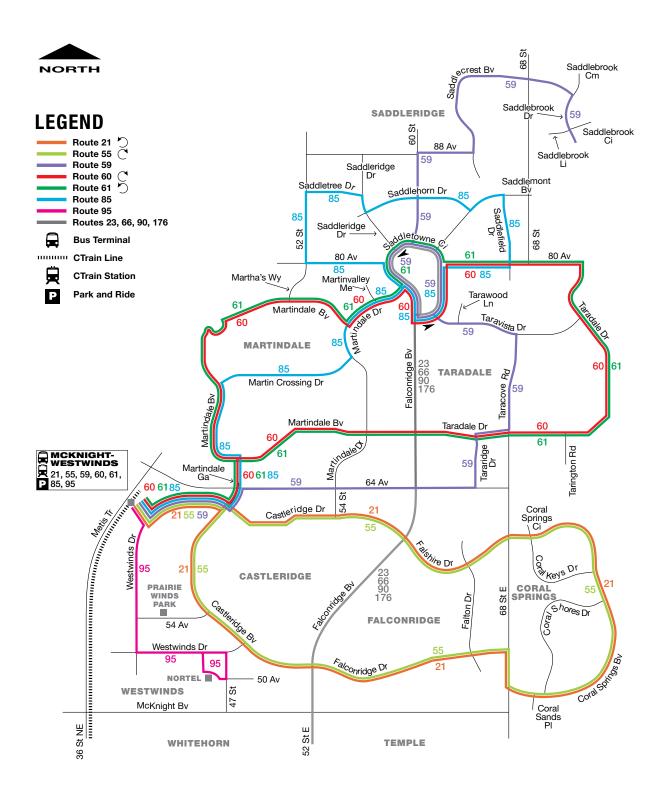

#### **Bus Routes**

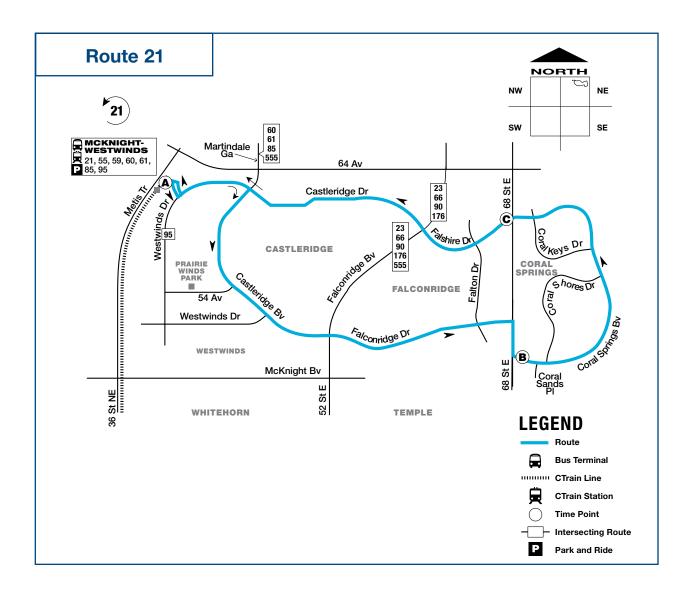

# CTrain map and frequencies Route 202 McKnight-Westwinds/ City Centre

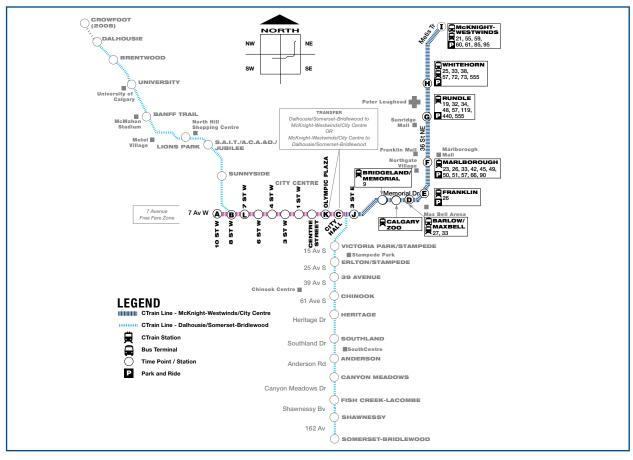

# Public art at the McKnight-Westwinds Station



The City of Calgary Public Art Program provides cultural leadership and opportunity, guides the evolution of a distinct and vibrant artistic character for the city's emerging public places and ensures a visual legacy for all to enjoy.

Implemented in early 2004, the program is a Council-approved system of processes that guide how The City commissions, acquires and manages visual art pieces and collections.

Calgary Transit, in collaboration with The City of Calgary Public Art Program, commissioned an artist team – Jim Hirschfield and Sonya Ishii – to design artwork for the McKnight-Westwinds Station and Oliver Bowen Maintenance Facility.

The public art component of the McKnight-Westwinds LRT Station consists of installations in four areas. While each work of art has the capacity to stand alone, the pieces are also visually and conceptually linked to one another.

The installation locations are:

- Glass near the LRT platform.
- Surfaces on the LRT columns
- The plaza of the station
- Stand-alone structures near the entrance to the Park and Ride lot.

Jim and Sonya's public art make use of historical images etched into glass or metal, as well as metal sculptural forms.





# **Transit** fares

Transit fares are the same for the bus and the CTrain. There are a number of ways to pay for your trip:

#### Fare options (subject to change)

A valid ticket, monthly pass, day pass, transfer or exact cash fare is required to ride Calgary Transit buses or CTrains.

# Transit information sources

A little advance planning makes your transit trip more comfortable and convenient. The following are some of our information sources:

#### **Calgary Transit website**

calgarytransit.com provides information about Customer Services, fares, individual route maps, schedules and accessible transportation.

#### **Teleride**

Teleride is an interactive telephone system that provides the most current schedule information for your bus stop. Call 974-4000 and enter your four-digit stop number, (located at the bottom of the sign at your bus zone) to obtain current and future schedule times or general transit information.

#### **Transit maps and schedules**

The Transit map shows all Calgary Transit bus and CTrain routes. These maps are available at the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre (224 Seventh Ave. S.W.), the plaza level of the downtown Municipal Building and some vendors.

The schedules for each individual route list the times when the bus leaves your starting point and when you'll reach your destination. The schedules also list bus stop locations, a route map, the four-digit Teleride numbers and other helpful information. Schedules are available from the Calgary Transit Customer Service Centre, your bus operator or call 262-1000 or TTY 268-8087 (for hearing impaired).

#### **Customer Service**

The Customer Service Centre (224 Seventh Ave. S.W.) is open weekdays from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. You can purchase passes or tickets, obtain printed transit maps, route schedules and other brochures or receive help planning your transit trip. The Lost Property office is also located here (telephone 268-1600).

Customer Service representatives can be reached at 262-1000 (6 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays and 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends and holidays). Customer Service representatives can assist you in finding the bus or CTrain route you need, tell you where your bus zone or stop is located and where to transfer for connecting transit services.

#### **Access Calgary**

Access Calgary is responsible for managing eligibility, booking, scheduling and dispatching shared-ride, door-to-door transportation services for Calgarians with disabilities. Access Calgary was formed in the spring of 2001 in order to integrate transportation services that had been provided separately through Calgary Handi-Bus and Special Needs Taxi. #### Safety and security measures

Uniformed and plain-clothed Protective Services officers patrol Calgary Transit facilities around-the-clock. They protect transit customers, employees and property, promote public safety and awareness and enforce bylaws and provincial statutes 24/7 on all Calgary Transit property.

A network of over 330 closed-circuit cameras exist throughout the CTrain line. They monitor the stations, platforms, escalators, halls and stairs. These cameras are overseen around-the-clock by Calgary Transit personnel. All CTrain cars, platforms and stations are equipped with a red HELP button. In an emergency, customers can contact Calgary Transit Control Centre personnel who will provide instructions and send emergency help immediately. Calgary Transit bus operators also have radio-equipment they use in an emergency to notify the appropriate personnel.

Calgary Transit has implemented a new online service, Trip Planning on the Web, that allows you to easily plan your next trip by bus or CTrain. You simply enter where you wish to go and where you will be leaving from, and receive up to five itineraries on how to travel there by Calgary Transit bus or CTrain. Also included in the itineraries will be the schedule times of when to leave, the time you will arrive at your destination and any transfer connections you will need to make, as well as the duration of your trip.

Along with trip planning information, you can find the closest bus stops to where you live, work or play and route schedules that will provide times for a single stop, the main time points or all stops along the route.
