# THREE EASY CHOICES

## MONTHLY PASS

Monthly passes are convenient!

- Purchase your pass at the beginning of the month and enjoy unlimited rides for that month on regular bus and C-Train service.
- Your pass may also be loaned to family and friends, but may be used only by one person at a time.
- Show your pass to the operator when boarding a bus.
- Keep the pass with you as proof of payment when on the C-Train and in Fare Restricted Areas.
- Monthly passes can be purchased at all CT Fare Option Vendors listed on this map.

## TICKET BOOKS

A book of 10 tickets is handy and economical!

- Tear a ticket out of the book and drop it into the farebox when boarding the bus.
- When using the C-Train be sure to validate your ticket at a Ticket Machine before entering the Fare Restricted Area. When transferring from the C-Train to a bus, present your ticket to the driver. Please do not put validated tickets into the farebox. The tickets can be used at any time, there's no expiry date.

## CASH

**EXACT CASH** should be deposited into the farebox when boarding the bus.

**PLEASE USE COINS!** Using coins instead of paper currency will help Calgary Transit lower costs associated with emptying jammed fareboxes and processing crumpled dollar bills.

When using the C-Train be sure to purchase a ticket receipt from a Ticket Vending Machine before entering the Fare Restricted Area. Exact change is required for these machines, they do not provide change. Dollar coins can be used.

Please remember that change for the ticket machines is not available at all stations, be sure to bring exact change with you.

# USE THIS GUIDE

Keep this GET AROUND GUIDE handy. It shows which routes to use, frequency of service, fares and describes many of Calgary Transit's special services.

## PLAN YOUR TRIP

Using Calgary Transit requires some planning. Before leaving, consult this Guide and determine which route(s) you will use to reach your destination. Next, consult a route schedule to find out when the bus or C-Train will reach your stop and when you'll reach your destination. Knowing when the bus (or C-Train) arrives will minimize your waiting time. Take time to check for your return trip too.

Before starting your trip, remember to call your Teleride number. You'll find out when the next two or three buses are scheduled to arrive at your stop. Teleride information is current, and is updated whenever service delays occur.

## SECURITY

Calgary Transit is patrolled regularly by our uniformed and plainclothes Protective Services staff for your assistance, safety and security.

# TRANSIT TIPS

## TRANSFERS

If you must change routes during your journey, ask your driver for a transfer when you board the bus. The transfer allows you to board the first connecting bus or C-Train within 90 minutes of the time you received the transfer. If you have to make several transfers, ask the driver to check the transfer to ensure that it will remain valid for your entire journey.

## TRANSIT COURTESY

- Please respect the Priority Seating provided for the elderly and handicapped. These seats are designed to provide easy access for transit patrons with restricted mobility and are located near the front entrance of each bus and the doors of each C-Train.
- Please remember that the consumption of food and beverages is prohibited on Calgary Transit vehicles.
- Bicycles are prohibited on all Calgary Transit vehicles and in C-Train stations.
- Smoking is prohibited on Calgary Transit vehicles and in all C-Train stations. No smoking signs are posted in accordance with Bylaw 15M85.
- As a courtesy to your fellow passengers and to assist in minimizing maintenance costs, please do not put your feet on the seats.

# TOLERIDE

## WHAT IS TOLERIDE?

- Teleride is a computerized telephone information system.
- Teleride gives you reliable schedule arrival times for the next Calgary Transit buses due at your stop.
- Teleride is available using any telephone, anywhere.
- Every Calgary Transit stop has its own telephone number.
- When you call the number, a friendly computer voice will tell you the scheduled arrival times of the next two or three buses for that stop.

- Write down the Teleride number of the stops you use most. Keep the Teleride numbers near your telephone.

## FACTS ABOUT BUS ZONES

- Bus routes generally operate along collector standard roadways in residential areas.
- No parking is permitted within a bus zone.
- Bus zones are usually located immediately beyond intersections (on the far side) to ensure safety for both pedestrians and vehicles.
- Prospective buyers should be aware that bus zone locations in new subdivisions are established prior to residential construction. In most cases, the zone will have a concrete apron and/or lengths of vertical curbing.

# OLYMPIC TRANSPORTATION

Calgary hosts the XV Olympic Winter Games from February 13-28, 1988. Throughout the Games, Calgary Transit will provide additional bus and C-Train service so it's easy for you, your family and friends to get around town.

## FOR EVENTS IN CALGARY ...

Your Olympic sporting event ticket gives you free access on all Calgary Transit services to and from the venue on the day of the event. Simply show your ticket to the bus operator or fare inspector on the C-Train.

## Parking

If you decide to drive your own vehicle, limited free reserved parking is available at the Olympic Park 'N' Ride lots shown on the map (see other side of this page).

Reservations to use these lots must be made in person at BASS Ticket Service Ltd. The reservation system applies only if you have Olympic sporting event tickets for events at these locations.

- Canada Olympic Park
- Olympic Saddledome
- Stampede Corral
- McMahon Stadium

For Canada Olympic Park, parking is available on-site at Old Barfoot Coach Rd. and 65 Street S.W. A very steep hill must be traversed to reach the site.

## TO REACH NAKISKA OR CANMORE NORDIC CENTRE

- Pay \$15.00/person return or \$7.50/person one-way for a ticket on the Express Bus service to travel directly to the venue. Express buses depart from the Downtown Olympic Passenger Terminal, located on 3 St. S.E. between 6 Ave. and 9 Ave. S.E. (next to the Municipal Building).

OR

- Car pool (3 or more people per vehicle) and park free near the site, then ride the free shuttle service to the venue. Use Trans Canada Highway or Highway 1A to help reduce congestion.

# USING THE C-TRAIN

There are two C-Train routes:

- Route 201 - Anderson/University begins at Anderson Station in the south, travels along 7th Avenue (Downtown) and continues to University Station in the Northwest.
- Route 202 - Whitehorn operates between Whitehorn Station in the Northeast and Downtown.

## 7TH AVENUE FREE FARE ZONE

The C-Train is free along the 7th Avenue Transit Mall, between 10 Street West and 4 Street East. A fare must be paid to travel beyond 7th Avenue by C-Train and on all buses.

## IDENTIFY YOUR TRAIN

Both the Anderson/University and Whitehorn C-Trains operate on 7th Avenue S.W. Watch the digital information signs located at all 7th Avenue C-Train platforms for a message that identifies the approaching train.

Each train is identified with a destination sign on the front and rear of each car:

**ANDERSON - Route 201** trains travelling south to Anderson Station.


**UNIVERSITY - Route 201** trains travelling north to University Station.
